Since 2000, I have worked extensively in education and community service across Monterey County. I began as an agricultural lab technician in Watsonville, later serving as a HEP lead teacher at CSUMB, where I helped farmworkers earn their GEDs. Since 2016, I have taught mathematics at Monterey Peninsula College and more recently at Hartnell College, supporting students in subjects such as statistics, calculus, and algebra.

Beyond the classroom, I have developed 11 iOS apps, prepared immigrants in the Salinas Valley for U.S. citizenship, taught basic English at local libraries in East Salinas and Castroville to help all minorities pass USCIS interviews, and translated DACA forms for Oaxacans. During the COVID-19 pandemic, I collaborated with faith-based organizations to assist low-income families with rental aid from many communities between Castroville and King City.

I have a master's degree in Environmental Engineering (UNAM) and a PhD in Applied Mathematics and Statistics (UC Santa Cruz).

As a congressional candidate, I pledge to represent minorities and people of color, advocate for comprehensive immigration reform (the first one in more than 30 years), expand affordable healthcare for middle-class families, establish term limits for members of Congress, and protect constitutional rights and freedoms.
