All candidates are urged to file the required documents as early as possible to avoid a last-minute rush, confusion, or misunderstanding. Additionally, it is recommended that the candidate files all documents personally. Dates marked with an asterisk (*) indicate that it falls on a weekend or holiday, so the activity is generally moved to the next business day.
