ARGUMENT AGAINST MEASURE U.

Measure U poses a serious threat to San Lorenzo Valley Water District and the safety of its residents. Do you want safe, reliable water from your tap, sufficient water to fight the next wildfire? And prompt repairs to pipelines after damage from the next winter storms? If so, vote NO.

Measure U will plunge the district into a serious financial crisis. Damage from the CZU fires and winter storms is still being repaired. Projects are currently underway addressing low water pressure, insufficient fire hydrants, aging infrastructure, and undersized pipes.

If Measure U passes, many **capital improvement projects will come to a grinding halt**. **Firefighters will have inadequate waterflow** from old or nonexistent fire hydrants when facing the next fire, and already overworked **district** staff **won't have the resources to repair broken pipes** after the next storm.

By capping rate increases, Measure U will reduce annual revenue by about \$1.5M in the first year. **The shortfall will increase** precipitously in subsequent years until another rate increase is proposed, which will cost more money, take months, and may not be approved. FEMA *might* reimburse us for *some* disaster related damage, but **the District must fund the repairs first. Without reliable income** from fixed charges, the District **won't be able to borrow** enough money to do this work.

Measure U will *temporarily* save most residential ratepayers around \$17.32/month, but **in the long run it will cost them much more.** Broken pipes and leaky tanks are neither cost efficient nor ecological. Just ask the customers of the Big Basin Water Company to understand the *real* costs of deferring maintenance.

Vote NO on Measure U if you expect safe, reliable, water to flow from your tap when you want to drink, shower, do laundry, water your garden, flush your toilet, or fight fires.
